Africa: the youngest continent in the world



- ✓ 200 million (20%)15-24 years
- ✓ 700 million below 30 years

- ✓ The only continent with projected increase in its youth
- ✓ 10-12 million young people enter labour markets each year
- ✓ Largest workforce in the world by 2040

Africa had 15 years of sustained economic growth



✓ 6 of the10 fastest growing economies in last decade were in SSA

 Young people are 2 to 3 times more likely than their parents to be out of work

Unemployment highest among educated youth
